

ST. CATHERINE PHILOPTOCHOS SOCIETY

(Women of Action)

The Philoptochos of the Presentation of Christ is a group of women who work throughout the year to help those in need. They contribute financially to the National and Metropolis Philoptochos projects, such as St. Basil's Academy, the Children's Medical Fund Luncheon, medical and funeral expenses, and recovery from natural disasters—all, and more of which are described on the National Philoptochos website.

On the local level, St. Catherine was active all of 2019 in the project of Feeding the Hungry, from participating in the FOCUS and Rankin Center food programs to creating the "Warm Hugs" for homebound individuals who would welcome a home cooked meal. Philoptochos members have worked closely with Fr. Dean Kokanos on the food projects.

In May of 2019, the following officers of St. Catherine Philoptochos were elected: President—Sylvia Graziano, Vice-President—Stamatia Milburn, Recording Secretary—Roula Kyros, Corresponding Secretary—Tina Rushe, and Treasurer—Gail Mantzouridis. They encourage all of the women of the parish to become active members of Philoptochos.

Since September of 2019, our Philoptochos provided grocery store gift cards, hosted Pop-Up Pantries, held a fund-raising Soup-A-Thon, celebrated an early Thanksgiving with a Luncheon honoring the Feast Day of St. Catherine and hosted the Breakfast after the Christmas Pageant (with the help of Tasso Athans and Tom Milburn), held a Christmas Party at Edgewood Country Club, provided refreshments for the Christmas Retreat, and responded to requests of those in need, where possible.

St. Catherine offers many thanks to Stanley Prestogeorge for providing the coffee each Sunday for the Fellowship Hour. The financial contributions of those who enjoy the Fellowship Hour and the delicious pastry that all of the women of the Church donate are very much appreciated. This activity provides a constant income for the Philoptochos to use for charitable purposes.

Some of the scheduled items for 2020 for Philoptochos include: February — Matching a contribution of the Parish Council to contribute to a charity for those affected by the fires in Australia;, March--Hosting the first of the Lenten Suppers; May—Producing an entertaining Talent Show on May 30; while visiting community shut-ins when possible, continuing projects to feed the hungry, and especially planning to participate in the National Philoptochos Convention in Cleveland from June 28 through July 2, 2020, with the intention of sending two delegates to represent the St. Catherine Philoptochos Chapter. This is the first time the National Convention will be held in the Pittsburgh Metropolis.

Please contact Talent Show Chairperson Anastasia Andrews (412-398-3194), if you know of someone who would share his, or her talent for an entertaining night on May 30, in the Olympia Hall. Part of the proceeds from the event will benefit the Lending Hearts Charity that works with children with cancer. Mark your calendar to attend.





EXPLORING MUSICAL CONNECTIONS

"How Sweet the Sound" is an innovative musical event taking place February I at 3:00 p.m. at Annunciation Cathedral in Columbus. Through the performances and presentations, the conference asks: What can a musical style from one Christian tradition reveal about another? What can we learn about one another through musical collaboration and experimentation? And how can music help us build bridges across communities? This event will explore the connections between Eastern Orthodoxy and Black Gospel music by presenting a newlycomposed setting of the Orthodox Vespers in a Black Gospel style. The composer, Dr. Shawn Wallace, is a professor of jazz at The Ohio State University and a convert to Orthodoxy. The performers are experts in the Black Gospel tradition.

The performance will be preceded by presentations from Dr. Peter Bouteneff, a professor of Systemic Technology at St. Vladimir's Seminary (who also directs of the Arvo Part project there) and Father Moses Berry, a priest of the Orthodox Church of America who specializes in the connections between African Orthodoxy and the African-American experience.
