

Dear Parish Family,

Over the last several weeks the Church has been slowly preparing us to enter into Lent through a period known as the Triodion. The first two Sunday Gospel readings of this time set an important tone for the entirety of the Fast.

On the first week we hear about the Pharisee in the temple. He was certain of his moral and spiritual superiority, especially compared to all those around him. And why shouldn't he be? The Pharisee knew all the rules and

followed them to the letter. And so he proudly announced this in his prayer. But we know from the reading that God's favor was upon the sinner who stood far off, examined himself quietly, and cried out to God for Mercy.

The next week we heard about the Older Brother of the Prodigal Son who was astounded when his rebellious little brother repented of his sinful lifestyle and was accepted with open arms by their father. Why would this father, who represents our Father in Heaven, want anything to do with a "former" sinner?

Of course we know two important things. First, no one lives and does not sin. Second, God does not desire the death of a sinner, rather that He should repent and live.

These two parables show us that the Lord calls us to examine ourselves and repent, which is to reorient our minds and hearts towards Him. What a blessing it is to have a time of year set aside to emphasize removing barriers between us and God!

Repentance takes on many different outward appearances throughout the Bible, from tears flowing onto the feet of our Savior, to a man standing quietly in the corner of the temple, to a son running to his father's open arms. But it always begins with the choice to turn away from sin and towards God.

In just a few short weeks the Great Lent will be upon us. This year, let's reconsider what it looks like in our daily lives to turn to God in all circumstances, and how additional services, prayer, and fasting can help us in this journey.

This will be the topic of our mid-Lenten retreat on March 30, to which everyone is invited. Join us, and bring a friend!

The gates of repentance are open before us. Let us walk the path together through the Great Lent to our Lord's Empty Tomb.



Susquehanna River Blessed

On January 27 the Orthodox Communities of the Greater Harrisburg area gathered in the afternoon to sanctify the Susquehanna River. More than one hundred faithful braved the cold weather to participate in the service, held at a special area on the river front. Following the initial service, they processed to the bridge from where three ice crosses were thrown into the River by various Orthodox clergymen of the area. Holy Trinity Greek Orthodox Cathedral of Camp Hill sponsored the reception that followed afterwards for all attendees (while a variety of foods were served, we have it on good authority that avgolemono soup "hit the spot" and was the favorite of all).


